

Restore Trust in international communications

major industrywide initiative to combat illegal/unwanted communications, spearheaded by i3Forum

- public trust issue stemming from spamming, phishing, spoofing, robocalling (and -texting)...
- National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) each step in to protect the public, address national situation and fight international incoming nuisance communications
- limited efficiency for int'l communications: structural focus on terminating end (consequence) vs. origin of coms (cause), "whack-a-mole" situation, lack of global clarity and alignment
- fragmented approach by individual NRAs creates unsustainable situation for int'l traffic carrying players
- international traffic carrying companies are part of the solution, need to be part of the discussion
- i3Forum spearheading industry-wide initiative to co-develop self/joint regulation for int'l ecosystem and collaborate with NRAs







GIRAF: Global Informal Regulatory Antifraud Forum

international industry coming together under One Consortium - the "Industry side" of the discussion, with public support from major industry organizations including GSMA

that is not enough:

- industry needs global clarity, consistency, and interaction with NRAs
- all parties need efficiency, global traceability and enforceability through cooperation
- NRAs need cooperation between terminating, transit and originating countries
- increase agility and focus of global NRA community, interacting with existing organizations: ITU-T Study Group 2; UCEnet, CEPT NaN2...

consequently:

- creation of the Global Informal Regulatory Antifraud Forum (GIRAF), an ad-hoc, informal framework open to all NRAs globally, to facilitate global multilateral alignment, cooperation, and structured collaboration with the industry (One Consortium)
- i3Forum working closely with a dozen+ European Regulators (CEPT ECC NaN2) to establish GIRAF in the coming weeks
- on-going outreach to NRAs in Africa, GCC, India, Singapore, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, Pacific Islands, USA, Canada, Brazil... – through i3Forum & One Consortium members

the international communications industry's contribution to restoring trust in calls and messages.

One Consortium for the international communications industry (voice and messaging)

- One Consortium, the industry pillar of the Restore Trust initiative, launched on March 15th, 2024
- One Consortium is an inclusive, not-for-profit organization specifically designed for the international communications ecosystem to join forces and cooperate with Telecommunications Regulators (NRAs) globally in order to fight illegal/unwanted voice calls and messages originating from abroad.
- Fraud calls and messages are a global problem, and many current initiatives are focused on the national level. One Consortium, working with NRAs, aims at complementing national initiatives, by helping combat illegal voice calls and messages on international connections
- One Consortium is the industry component of the broader Restore Trust initiative.
 The Restore Trust initiative, spearheaded by i3Forum, has a second aspect: an unprecedented initiative bringing together National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) globally to facilitate a global, structured dialogue between industry and telecommunications regulators on restoring trust.
- One Consortium and the Restore Trust initiative are endorsed by several major industry organizations, including i3Forum, GSMA, the Global Leaders Forum (GLF) and the Global Solutions Council (GSC)

- One Consortium is hosted by the i3Forum from a legal perspective.
 - One consortium is governed by the same by-laws and policies as i3Forum
 - One Consortium membership carries acceptance of that framework.
- One Consortium members are expected to fully comply, and One Consortium's leadership has all authority to verify and ensure compliance.
- Within that legal framework, One Consortium operates as an independent structure.
 - One Consortium does not report into the i3Forum leadership and makes its own operational decisions (deliverables, communication...)
 - One Consortium is governed by the One Consortium's Procedures that replace the i3Forum's Working Groups Procedures, and can amend them
- interim leadership structure to be replaced with elected leadership mechanism before January 1st, 2025
- target membership structure, funding mechanism, and governance model to be defined & implemented during interim phase – in time for 2025 budget cycle

who can join One Consortium?

 One Consortium is an inclusive organization open to international traffic carrying companies, (voice and messaging), vendors, global industry organizations, and other industry stakeholders.

how to join One Consortium?

- application form available on <u>www.oneconsortium.org</u> with all other documents
- application are reviewed and confirmed by One Consortium's leadership.
- upon acceptance, new members are kindly requested to sign and return the Membership Agreement
- no membership dues for now. Should this evolve in the future, existing members will be informed of any changes and provided with options
- two categories of members :
 - voting members: companies who carry and deliver international traffic and global associations representing them), and
 - non-voting members (all others)
 - In case of disagreement regarding applicable category, One Consortium's leadership has the final say.

who can join One Consortium and how

One Consortium membership is separate from i3Forum membership



focusing on pragmatic actionable deployable results

One Consortium's initial objectives are to allow this industry to:

- 1) Co-develop and agree global guidance and a vendor neutral "toolbox" of technologies, best-practices, processes etc. to efficiently combat illegal / unwanted communications (calls and messages) originating from abroad.
- 2) Drive adoption in the industry
- 3) Build an industry-wide self-governance to ensure compliance

One Consortium will be working closely with NRAs in the Global Informal Regulatory Antifraud Forum (GIRAF), including by holding multi-stakeholder sessions on specific topics
